To provide this site, we use cookies. A cookie is a small file that is sent with pages from this website and is stored by your browser on your computer's hard drive.

The use of cookies is of great importance for the proper functioning of our website, but cookies whose effect you don't directly see (such as Google Analytics) are also very important. Without anonymous input from visitors, we have no picture of how the website is used and how we can improve it.

Overview of cookies used

Below is a description of which cookies e-search places itself and which third-party cookies are used.

Google Analytics

Through Google Analytics, anonymized data about browsing behavior is collected on our site. This allows us to see how visitors like you use the website. We use this information to make informed decisions about the design of our website. We also optimize the functioning of the website with this. The information obtained is stored by Google on servers in the United States. Google also provides this information to advertisers to provide insight into the effectiveness of their campaigns. Google may provide this information to third parties if Google is legally required to do so, or to the extent these third parties process the information on behalf of Google. We have no influence on this. We have not allowed Google to use the obtained analytics information for other Google services.
